Student nominations should be sent (e-mail) by the Partner University to Ms. Barbara Pietrzkiewicz barbara.pietrzkiewicz@uni.wroc.pl, responsible for incoming students, before 1st June (winter semester) and 15th October (summer semester)
- **Application procedure**
All the nominated students should create an on-line account and follow the instructions to prepare the required documents (application form, learning agreement, copy of the passport, English language confirmation, ID photograph) which should be sent to the International Office of UWr before 15th June (winter semester) and 31st October (summer semester)

DISABLED

2. After having received the application form the Letter of Acceptance will be send within 6 weeks.
3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by TR ISTANBU 05 no later than the end of March for the 1st semester students, and no later than the end of September for the 2nd semester and full year students, after the assessment period has finished.
4. Termination of the agreement

The partner institutions will agree on the procedure for modifying or terminating the inter-institutional agreement. However, in the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. The termination clauses must include the following disclaimer: "Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict."]



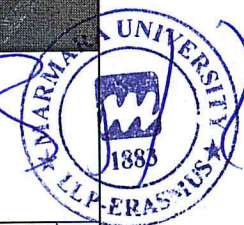
